"Hi Guys"

We are planning to have a Club members only Fun Fly Contest on Saturday, October 3, 2009. Contest will start at 10:00 AM. We will break at 12:30 for lunch. Club will furnish Drinks, hot dogs, brats, and Hamburgers. Bring a covered dish or desert. The contest will have two venues. Flyers will fly either Electric Planes or Glow Engine Planes. If you want, you can enter both venues.

The following is a list of events:

LIMBO- Two PVC pipes will be set up 40 feet apart and a ribbon will be placed between at 5 ft. high. If a flyer flies under the ribbon successfully the ribbon will be lowered in 1 ft. increments. The flyer the flies the lowest will receive 10 points. Second will receive 5 points and third will receive 3 points. Airplane has to fly at least 20 feet after clearing the ribbon. There can be ties if more than one flyer completes the task. Contestants will be allowed to stand near the pole when flying.

TAILHOOKER-Three ribbons will be placed across the runway at different spots 150 ft. apart. The will be on stands 10 ft. apart. The ribbons will be from 2 to 6 inches

above the pavement. A wire tail hook will be provided to tape to the bottom of the plane. Pilot will start at one end of the runway and fly, trying to snag or cut the ribbons. The flyer will receive 5 points to cut the first ribbon, 10 points to cut the second ribbon and 15 points to cut the third ribbon, all during one pass. Flyer will be allowed to abort two times if he has not cut any ribbons. Once you have cut a ribbon you are committed and your run has to be finished. Three points will be deducted every time a part of the airplane hits the ground during your run.

LOOP THE LOOP-Contestant will take off and climb to altitude. Once he gives the command the timer will start. The flyer has to complete as many loops as he can in 45 seconds. Two judges will decide if the loops count, a half loop won't count. Contestant receives 2 points for every loop they complete.

THE OLD BOMB DROP- A bull's eye will be set up in the middle of the runway. A cup will be attached to your plane and small bean bags will be used as bombs. The scoring is based on where the bean bag stops, not where it hits. 3 ft. Diameter bull's eye will count 10 points. 5 ft. ring will count 5 points and 10 ft ring will count 3 points. Each contestant will land, reload and drop a second bag. Each drop will count so a perfect score would be two bulls' eyes, or 20 points.

SPOT LANDING- The bull's eye will be used as the spot in the spot landing. When the plan hits the runway and rolls to a stop is where the spot is counted. Contestant must have the throttle down when he hits the ground. It would not be fair to land and taxi to the bull's eye. Scoring will be as follows, within 5 ft. of center of bull's eye, 10 points, 10 ft. of center, 7 points, 20 ft. of center, 5 points.

Prizes will be given for first place, in each venue, glow and electric. I am going to contact the hobby shops. We may have more prizes or door prizes.

We plan to vote on this at the next meeting. If you have any suggestions, our comments, please E-Mail me. This format is not etched in stone. We want to have a contest that is fun and enjoyed by all. If you have any other events that might work, let me know. See you at the meeting.
